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Request for Proposal for Legal Services

To Represent the Office of the West Virginia Attorney General

The Office of the West Virginia Attorney General (“WVAGO”) is seeking legal representation to assist with the investigation, evaluation, and potential prosecution of claims against entities involved in the administration of healthcare data systems and services.

Qualified law firms or attorneys are invited to submit a proposal on or before 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 17, 2026, to assist the WVAGO in this matter. The winning proposal, if any, will be selected as soon as possible after that date with representation to commence forthwith.

Background

The secure and reliable administration of healthcare data systems is of the utmost importance to the citizens of West Virginia. Healthcare providers, pharmacies, insurers, and patients rely on such systems for the processing of medical claims, the protection of sensitive personal and health information, and the uninterrupted delivery of care. Specifically, the WVAGO seeks to investigate a cybersecurity incident that resulted in unauthorized access to sensitive information and widespread disruption to healthcare operations.

Additionally, the WVAGO may require the assistance of the engaged law firm in the prosecution of any legal action to redress potential violations of state and federal statutes and regulations, including those arising from failures to implement reasonable data security measures and to ensure the continuity of critical healthcare services.

Accordingly, the WVAGO seeks particular experience as follows:

- Expertise in investigating and evaluating violations of state and federal law related to data security, cybersecurity incidents, and the protection of sensitive personal and health information;
- Expertise in investigating and evaluating violations of the West Virginia Consumer Credit Protection Act and other consumer protection statutes arising from data breaches, unfair or deceptive practices, and failure to safeguard consumer information;

- Significant experience litigating complex claims involving multistate or international entities, including those operating through digital platforms;
- Experience litigating complex claims involving large-scale data breaches, healthcare systems, and critical infrastructure disruptions;
- Experience and ability to handle complex civil discovery, including, but not limited to, extensive electronic discovery involving forensic data, systems logs, cybersecurity analyses, and large volumes of affected consumer information;
- Familiarity with healthcare systems and regulations, including the administration of healthcare data, claims processing systems, and applicable federal and state requirements governing protected health information; and
- Familiarity with cybersecurity standards and incident response practices, including evaluation of reasonable security measures and post-breach remediation efforts.

Scope of Representation

The client is the WVAGO. The attorney or firm, if any, that is selected as a result of this process will work in close coordination with the WVAGO, to provide legal services as set forth above.

Conflict of Interest Information

The attorney or firm must disclose any prior representation adverse to the WVAGO, as well as any matters that may create a potential or actual conflict, including but not limited to, any current or former representations of healthcare data administrators.

Representation of Other Public and Private Clients

1. A list of all matters the attorney or firm is or was retained to represent another state for a similar legal issue, against the same parties, or which advance(d) the same legal theories.
2. A list of all matters the attorney or firm is or was retained to represent any political subdivision of West Virginia (or another state) for a similar legal issue, against the same parties, or which advance(d) the same legal theories.
3. A list of all matters the attorney or firm is or was retained to represent any private entity for a similar legal issue, against the same parties, or which advance(d) the same legal theories.

For each of the above matters, please provide the outcome of the litigation.

Your Proposal

No specific form is required of your proposal, but it should address those factors identified in the Attorney General's Outside Counsel Policy,¹ and should also address your experience and demonstrated skill (via references, example documents, and/or a descriptive narrative) in the following practice areas:

- Expertise in investigating and evaluating violations of state and federal law related to data security, cybersecurity incidents, and the protection of sensitive personal and health information;
- Expertise in investigating and evaluating violations of the West Virginia Consumer Credit Protection Act and other consumer protection statutes arising from data breaches, unfair or deceptive practices, and failure to safeguard consumer information;
- Significant experience litigating complex claims involving multistate or international entities, including those operating through digital platforms;
- Experience litigating complex claims involving large-scale data breaches, healthcare systems, and critical infrastructure disruptions;
- Experience and ability to handle complex civil discovery, including, but not limited to, extensive electronic discovery involving forensic data, systems logs, cybersecurity analyses, and large volumes of affected consumer information;
- Familiarity with healthcare systems and regulations, including the administration of healthcare data, claims processing systems, and applicable federal and state requirements governing protected health information; and
- Familiarity with cybersecurity standards and incident response practices, including evaluation of reasonable security measures and post-breach remediation efforts.

¹ Pursuant to the Outside Counsel Policy, the Attorney General shall consider the following factors when determining the most competitive proposal for legal services:

- Whether the private attorneys possess the requisite skills and expertise needed to handle the legal matters in question;
- Whether the private attorneys possess requisite staffing and support to handle the scope of the litigation or matter;
- Whether the private attorneys, or any members of the private attorneys' law firm, have been subject to reprimand by the West Virginia State Bar, or other entities, for unethical conduct;
- Whether the private attorneys have been peer rated, and if so, what peer ratings they have received, along with any other recognitions or awards for legal services;
- The estimated fees, costs and expenses of the private attorneys to perform the legal services requested;
- The willingness of the private attorneys to enter into alternative billing arrangements;
- Whether the private attorneys are in compliance with all applicable laws of the State of West Virginia;
- Any potential conflicts of interest between the private attorneys and the State;
- Any relevant input from the state entity client, if applicable, regarding the needed legal services; and,
- Any such other relevant factors as may be identified by the Attorney General.

If you propose to bill hourly rates, please state them separately for each attorney or paralegal to be assigned to this representation and indicate the approximate proportion of total time that will be bill at each rate. Computerized legal research tools, such as WESTLAW or LEXIS, may not be billed as an expense. Please state your per-unit costs (if any) for expenses such as copying; whether you will bill for travel expenses and at what rate; and whether and how you bill for any additional attorney-time while traveling. Representations made in your proposal will supersede any conflicting terms that are less favorable to the client appearing in any written contract or invoice.

Any contingency fee agreement agreed upon will be governed by the requirements of W. Va. Code § 5-3-3A.

Evaluation and Acceptance

Your proposal will be evaluated by the Office of the Attorney General. Any and all proposals may be rejected. Your proposal should be addressed to the Office of the Attorney General and emailed to rfpresponse@wvago.gov. This Request for Proposal shall be known as RFP # 144, and any and all correspondences relating to this Request for Proposal should reference RFP # 144. All proposals must be received by email no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 17, 2026. Any questions regarding this Request for Proposal shall likewise be emailed to rfpresponse@wvago.gov.

Retention of the selected attorney or firm, if any, is conditioned upon execution of a written contract approved by the Attorney General. In no event will any such contract preclude the termination of the representation at any time by official action of the WVAGO.
